#### **Council Report:**

Mr. Jewett encouraged residents to park their cars off of the streets during snow events so that the service department can easily clean and plow the streets.

# **Manager's Report:**

Mrs. Callahan stated that the salt supply is holding up well. Mrs. Callahan said that the Village still has 200 tons of salt available for delivery and if the weather cooperates, we should be in good shape. Mrs. Callahan stated that there will be a public hearing on March 5<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. at the Town Hall Council Chambers regarding certain animals being permitted in residential areas. Mrs. Callahan informed Council that she received a flyer announcing an event that Congressman Steve Chabot will be hosting in Franklin on March 2<sup>nd</sup> from 8:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. Mrs. Callahan stated that elected officials are invited and it would be great if someone from Council would be available to attend and represent Carlisle. Mayor Winkler said that he would not be able to go due to work obligations and he would appreciate it if someone else from Council would be available. Mr. Fryman stated that he would be available to attend the event. Mr. Lickliter questioned Mrs. Callahan about the monthly report from the Police Chief. Mr. Lickliter stated that the year to date totals were incorrect and Mrs. Callahan said that she would get a corrected copy sent out to Council.

# First Reading of Ordinances and Resolutions:

ORD. 3-15: AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$963,000 OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES BY THE MUNICIPALITY OF CARLISLE, OHIO TO PROVIDE FUNDS TO RENEW BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES ORIGINALLY ISSUED FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING ROAD IMPROVEMENTS IN THE MUNICIPALITY.

Mrs. Callahan stated that this ordinance is a Bond Anticipation Note regarding State Route 123, Phases 4 through 7 and represents a \$57,000 reduction from the previous note. Mrs. Callahan said that Eagle Ridge TIF monies are used to pay down the note.

With no further discussion, Mayor Winkler stated that this legislation would be on for a second reading at the March 10<sup>th</sup> meeting.

ORD. 4-15: AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,600,000 OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES, FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING A PORTION OF THE COST OF MAKING ROAD IMPROVEMENTS IN THE MUNICIPALITY.

Mrs. Callahan said that this ordinance is a Bond Anticipation Note for a new issuance of \$1.6 million for road improvements for Union Road/Fairview Drive. Mrs. Callahan stated that this note will be serviced by a \$331,000 OPWC grant and Timber Ridge TIF money.

With no further discussion, Mayor Winkler stated that this legislation would be on for a second reading at the March 10<sup>th</sup> meeting.

# Second and Third Readings of Ordinances and Resolutions: none

Mayor Winkler stated that Council would move into executive session for one discussion item: Economic Development –to consider confidential information related to marketing plans, business strategy, production techniques, trade secrets, etc. of an applicant for economic development assistance.
